of the Parish.



XXXI Sunday in Ordinary Time

This Sunday's passage tells the story of Jesus' meeting with Zacchaeus. It is a very touching story, full of character. In that story we could recognize ourselves in it and discover how Jesus has been and continues to be at work in the world.

There are three characters in the story: Zacchaeus, Jesus, and the complainers. Each of these is a universal symbol; all people and all communities have lived the three stories at one time or another.

Zacchaeus is the symbol of those who experience that "salvation" has come to both individuals and communities. We know from our faith that final and complete "salvation" will "come to our house" only at the end of time. In the course of our lives what we have are temporary and partial experiences of salvation

The story of Zacchaeus tells us that "salvation" is an experience of healing and reconciliation, so deep that we exclaim with gratitude in the words of Jesus, "Today salvation has indeed

Jesus is the symbol of the care-giver, the one who "comes to save what was lost."

Why Do We Do That? **Catholic Traditions Explained**

Why do we have a liturgical season called ordinary time? Can you explain?

Answer:

Ordinary time is the longest season of the liturgical year. It begins the Monday after January 6, the Epiphany, and goes until the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent. That period can last anywhere from five to eight weeks, depending on when Easter is celebrated. Ordinary time picks up again the Monday after Pentecost Sunday and lasts from twenty-three to twenty-seven weeks, until the end of the liturgical year, the Saturday before Advent begins.

Why the name ordinary? "Ordinary" is not in contrast to "extraordinary" or "special" but rather stresses the Latin language notion of "ordinal" or numbered Sundays. The Latin title for the season, tempus ordinarium, conveys the sense that this time of the year is measured or numbered time. Measured time can allude simply to the numbered Sundays, or the notion that these Sundays are a "measured" time to deepen and immerse ourselves completely in the realities of Jesus' incarnation, ministry, passion, death, and resurrection. Ordinary time offers us the opportunity to connect the ordinary lived experiences of our lives with those of Jesus, who modeled for us how to live a truly human existence.

The Dedication of the Lateran Basilica

The Lateran Basilica, it is the place where the Pope has his "cathedra" or Episcopal throne, has the title "Mother and Head of all the Churches of the City and the World". On this day we both celebrate and pray for the unity of those churches gathered in communion with successor of Saint Peter. This is a day to reflect on how this building, the cathedrals and churches everywhere are not just meeting-places, but visible signs to the world of the Body of Christ in prayer.


