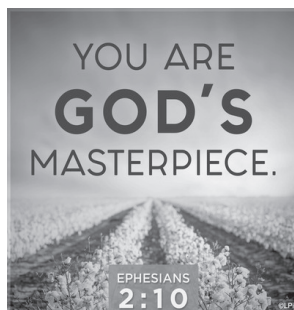

Feast of St. Stanislaus Kostka – Nov. 10

1550 - Born in Rostkowo, Poland.

1564 - Left Poland to continue his education in Vienna, Austria.

1567 - Left Vienna secretly and joined the Jesuit religious order in Rome.

1568 - Died in Rome on August 15.

1606 - Declared "blessed" by Pope Paul V.

1726 - Canonized in Rome on December 31 by Pope Benedict XIV.

St. Stanislaus Kostka was proclaimed by Pope John XXIII as a patron saint of Poland. Traditionally he is also a patron saint of youth. Many schools bear the name of this saint whose life was filled with study and prayer. Polish immigrants venerate St. Stanislaus as their special intercessor, since he spent the last four years of his short life outside of his native country. Numerous churches in the world, especially in the United States, have been named after him - among them our parish church.

XXXII Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Those who are deemed worthy to attain to the coming age and to the resurrection of the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage." Jesus' response to the Sadducees regarding their question about the resurrection of the dead actually raises another question for us: what about marriage in heaven? We understand marriage to be "until death do us part," but what exactly becomes of this special relationship in the afterlife?

Pope Francis gave a homily on this Gospel passage in which he discussed the mysterious transformation that will take place for those who enter into the joy of heaven. The Holy Father tells us, Jesus explains that "life after death does not have the same parameters as our earthly life. Eternal life is another life, in another dimension where, among other things, there will be no marriage... The life that God prepares for us is not a mere embellishment of the present one: it surpasses our imagination, for God continually amazes us with His love and mercy" (Angelus, November 10, 2013).

Why Do We Do That?**Catholic Traditions Explained****Question:**

As we celebrate Veteran's Day, I'm wondering what should be the Christian attitude in resorting to violence to resolve conflicts?

Answer:

Veterans are rightly honored for their role in defending the country, especially in time of conflict and violence. Yet, resorting to violence as a means of trying to resolve human conflicts is not the Christian way to deal with relationships. Jesus models the image of God in which all are valued and cherished as God's children, no matter who they are or which side they are on. Sometimes violence may be justified, but only as a means of last resort, when all possible options have been exhausted, and when greater harm might result. In times of war and military struggles, it is difficult to make these kinds of distinctions. Those who fight and defend under such circumstances must be supported, cared for, valued, and honored. Let us pray for all veterans, as well as for those who seek to negotiate peace, that God may truly guide us all in the path of justice.

Chrystus zanim Sam potwierdził przez Swoje zmartwychwstanie, że jest Panem życia i śmierci, odwołuje się do Starego Testamentu: „A że umarli zmartwychwstają, to i Mojżesz zaznaczył tam, gdzie jest mowa o krzaku, gdy Pana nazywa Bogiem Abrahama, Bogiem Izaaka i Bogiem Jakuba. Bóg nie jest Bogiem umarłych, lecz żywych, wszyscy, bowiem dla Niego żyją”. Cała Biblia jest opowieścią o życiu człowieka, które rozpoczyna się w materialnej przestrzeni czasu a w Bogu otwiera się na wieczność. Jak będzie wyglądać ta wieczność? 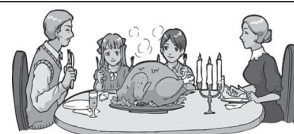

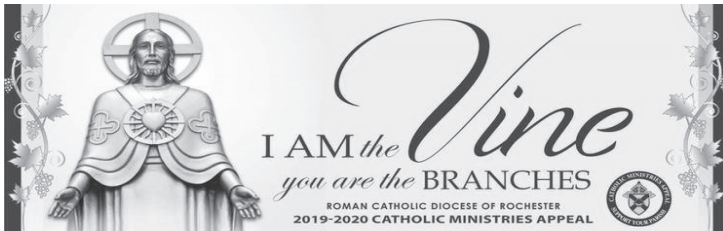
