

Recognize God in Your Ordinary Moments: Listen. Think. Act.

This is a mantra or slogan for many different groups. Some seek to battle prejudice and bias. Other groups hope to eliminate poverty or reduce crime. The most fruitful actions are those that take place after careful reflection. This is an important thing to remember for those trying to live a stewardship way of life. If we are honest with ourselves, too often most of us jump to conclusions too quickly or act in ways that cause friction because we didn't really think about the consequences of our actions. We are moving too fast in a world that seems to be moving ever faster. When the shepherds came to visit Jesus, the Newborn King, they told Mary everything that the angels had told them. Luke tells us that after hearing all this, she "kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart." No response. No panic. No action. Her reflection was the appropriate response.

In this New Year, you and I would do well to remember this Gospel account of Mary, the Mother of God. Let us resolve to listen more, reflect often, and then act accordingly. We are called to use our gifts wisely, sowing them in good soil. If we just throw them out, allowing them to simply fall wherever they may, have we really used them for God's glory? We need to listen. Think, Then act.

The Holy Family

"Rise, take the child and his mother, flee to Egypt, and stay there until I tell you." 725 kilometers. That's the distance on modern roads from Bethlehem to Cairo. Assuming one covered 40km a day on foot — ambitious for two young parents and their infant son — the journey would take well over two weeks. Of course, the Holy Family didn't have modern roads. They would travel through wilderness, fear bandits, run low on water, and cross the vast Sinai Peninsula in a reverse of their forefathers in Exodus. Here, in struggle and sacrifice, are the beginnings of the forging of the Holy Family.

Joseph rose and took the child and his mother by night and departed for Egypt. He stayed there until the death of Herod." Large Jewish communities existed in most major cities of the ancient Mediterranean world, after the collapse of their kingdoms chronicled in the Old Testament, and Joseph could likely find work as a carpenter. All the same, today's Gospel reminds us that the first formational years of Jesus as a babe-in-arms were spent in a strange land. The members of the Holy Family were foreigners, outsiders, immigrants.

The Word became flesh and dwelt among us. God took on our humanity. He is in solidarity with our own trials and difficulties. On the feast of the Holy Family, we honor the special place of the family within society. We are invited, too, to recall those families who share in the struggles of the Holy Family in a particular way. We pray for immigrants, asylum seekers, and refugees. We pray for all parents who sacrifice their own well-being and comfort so their children may have a better life.

Recognize God in Everyday Moments

Many people move through life without any direction. They find themselves constantly rerouting and wondering when they will ever get to a satisfying final destination. What they need is a compass and a companion for the journey. Yet they have no idea how to get either.

Prayer can serve as a compass, and it connects us to a companion for the journey. Stewardship living is impossible without prayer. If we count on our own will and believe we can become fruitful without daily contact with the Divine, we can find ourselves looking for directions more than moving toward a destination. God, through prayer, will help us see all we have as a gift. God, through prayer, will lead us away from materialism and selfishness and toward freedom and generosity. Even when we fall to sin, the path back is clearer. God's GPS signal is never really lost.

Uroczystość Świętej Bożej Rodzicielki, Maryi

Pierwszy dzień nowego roku to Uroczystość Świętej Bożej Rodzicielki Maryi. W tym dniu jest obowiązek uczestnictwa we mszy św. Kościół obchodzi w tym dniu również Światowy Dzień Pokoju, ustanowiony przez Pawła VI listem z dnia 8 grudnia 1967 r., skierowanym do wszystkich ludzi dobrej woli, nie tylko katolików. Papież zaproponował, aby na całym świecie w pierwszy dzień nowego roku kalendarzowego modlono się szczególnie w intencji pokoju.

Uroczystość Świętej Bożej Rodzicielki Maryi to najstarsze Maryjne święto obchodzone już przed Soborem w Efezie (431 r.), na którym przyznano Maryi tytuł "Theotokos" (Bogarodzica). Poświęcenie Maryi pierwszego dnia nowego roku ukazuje Maryję również jako najdoskonalsze stworzenie, i pierwsze które skorzystało z darów Chrystusa. Pierwszy dzień Nowego Roku to ósmy dzień od Narodzenia Chrystusa - koniec oktawy Bożego Narodzenia. Maryja z Józefem wypełnili więc prawo żydowskie przepisy Halachy, która mówi że w osiem dni po urodzeniu syn ma zostać obrzezany oraz nadaje się mu wówczas imię. Wybrano zatem bardzo stosowny dzień, aby po wyśpiewaniu hymnów dziękczynnych Wcielonemu Słowu, złożyć odpowiedni hołd Jego Świętej Rodzicielce. Podkreśla to ścisły związek między Bożym Narodzeniem i Boskim Macierzyństwem Maryi.

Józefie. Jest on opiekunem Syna Bożego. On jest również Jej opiekunem. W pełni odnajduje się w tej roli. Realizuje swoje życiowe powołanie. Dzisiejsze święto mówi, że świat kręci się wokół rodziny. Rodziny ludzkiej i Bożej a można by powiedzieć: rodziny Bożo-ludzkiej.
