By now everyone knows that to limit spread of the Coronavirus COVID-19, ALL public Masses (Diocese of Rochester) are suspended until further notice. Fr. Roman will offer Mass each day fulfilling a scheduled Mass intentions as well as praying for all entrusted to his pastoral care.

Fourth Sunday of Lent

"Do you believe in the Son of Man?" Jesus wants to motivate each one of us to see the truth. After developing a relationship with Jesus, the blind man "sees" as someone very special. The Pharisees, due to the blindness caused by their ignorance, prejudice, and need for self-preservation, still remain blind. Presuppositions, prejudices, assumptions, and our needs can easily blind us to truth. We see what we want or need to see and not what is really there. In addition, our stubbornness continues to convince us that we are right and that our vision is perfect. Only God can complete the picture.

Look around at our world. So much of what is happening today is due to the reluctance of folks to allow themselves to be stretched and brought to see what is really there. Many react to what life presents to them more with the lenses of ignorance than lenses of clarity. The Gospel carries great transformative value. With it, God corrects our vision and replaces our limited sight with the fullness of his sight. God opens our eyes so that we can see that it is not about preserving what we have created but of living in the immensity and wonder of God's kingdom.

Through a simple, loving relationship with God, we can break through the tethers of prejudice, eradicate fear, dispel the darkness of hatred and sin, discover freedom, live in peace, work for justice, be effective stewards of creation, assist the migrant and the immigrant, and safeguard our economic systems and policies so that they truly serve all of God's children. What we see is often an artificial lie. Our truth is much bigger than what our limited sight believes it to be. Allow God to work in and through you. Do not be afraid. Be open and be humble enough to know that you need help. Many human beings are living with severe cataracts that produce sight that is at best blurred. Are you one of them?

Why Do We Do That? Catholic Traditions Explained

Question: Does God make people suffer because of their sins?

Answer: Let's use the analogy of parents. If your children did something wrong, would you make them suffer? In other words, would you make them feel pain just because they did something wrong? You might chastise them, and the punishment or correction might not be pleasant, but out of love for your children, you will not hurt them just to hurt them. Sometimes, they suffer the consequences of their actions and that is punishment enough. You hope they learn and grow from their choices, good and bad.

God is a Loving Father. He allows us to suffer the consequences of our sins, so that we will turn to Him for His love and forgiveness. God wants us to grow in holiness, in virtue, in grace. He gives us free will so that we can choose, and the choices we make either bring us joy or bring us suffering. From that, we learn and grow. God does not hurt us or make us suffer to get even with us. He loves us and wants the best for us. When we suffer, he suffers with us so that we know how much we need Him and how much He loves us.

Dear Jesus, you always went out of your way to help the broken and hurting. I want to follow in your footsteps.

Czwarta Niedziela Wielkiego Postu

W dzisiejszej Ewangelii uzdrowienie człowieka od urodzenia ślepego, zaprasza nas by skupić się na fizyczne i duchowe aspekty oczu i światła. Uzdrowienie jest kontrowersyjne, ponieważ Jezus uzdrawia w szabat. Faryzeusze, władze religijne czasu Jezusa, wiedza że prawo Mojżeszowe zakazało pracy (w tym uzdrowienie) w szabat. Mają też problemy, wierzyć, że Jezus dokonał cudu.

Ostateczne objawienie i moment oświecenia jest kiedy ślepy człowiek napotka Jezusa ponownie. Jezus szuka ślepego człowieka i objawia się jemu jako Syn Boży. W tej chwili ślepy człowiek okazuje się człowiekiem wiary i czci Jezusa. Jezus odpowiada identyfikując ironie doświadczenia wielu ludzi po spotkaniu Jezusa: teraz widać tych, którzy są ślepi, i tych, którzy widzą a teraz znajdują się ślepi. Przez spotkanie z Jezusem człowiek urodzony ślepy jest uzdrowiony, wzrok jest przywrócony, i zaczyna się jego konwersja do naśladowania.

Ślepy człowiek stopniowo dochodzi do większego zrozumienia kim jest Jezus i co to znaczy być jego uczniem, podczas gdy faryzeusze (tych, którzy powinni zobaczyć) są ci, którzy pozostają ślepi.

Zwiastowanie Pańskie

Uroczystość **Zwiastowania Pańskiego**, dawniej nazywana świętem **Zwiastowania N.M.P.** obchodzona corocznie 25 marca, przypomina nam o tym wielkim zdarzeniu, od którego rozpoczęła się nowa era w dziejach ludzkości. Archanioł Gabriel przyszedł do Maryi, niewiasty z Nazaretu, by zwiastować Jej, że to na Niej spełnią się obietnice proroków, a Jej Syn, którego pocznie w cudowny i dziewiczy sposób za sprawą Ducha Świętego, będzie Synem samego Boga. Fakt, że uroczystość ta przypada często w trakcie Wielkiego Postu uzmysławia nam, że tajemnica Wcielenia jest nierozerwalnie związana z tajemnicą śmierci i zmartwychwstania Chrystusa.
